The University of St. Thomas Department of Public Safety is issuing this timely warning to inform the campus community about a burglary that occurred earlier today, July 1, 2025.

At approximately 6:38 p.m., a male suspect (Suspect 1) forcibly entered Building 85G by prying open the south entrance. He then proceeded to the north entrance and provided access to a second male (Suspect 2). Together, the suspects entered a dorm room currently under renovation, the communal laundry room, and the community lounge.

Fortunately, no damage was reported, and no property appears to have been stolen.

A vigilant university employee observed the suspicious activity and promptly contacted Public Safety. Officers quickly responded, arriving on scene and apprehending Suspect 2. Suspect 1 fled northbound into the surrounding neighborhood before additional officers arrived. The Saint Paul Police Department responded and took custody of Suspect 2.

Descriptions of the suspects are as follows:

#### **Suspect 1 (Not in Custody):**

- Height: Approximately 5'10"
- Weight: Approximately 160 lbs
- Clothing: Silver shorts, durag, no shirt
- Carrying: Blue duffle bag

#### **Suspect 2 (Apprehended):**

- Height: Approximately 5'8"
- Weight: Approximately 145 lbs
- Clothing: Black hat, black underwear
