


Year-End Giving

Go To College: Auditing of Undergraduate Classes

Lifelong learners (age 40-plus) are encouraged to continue their education by taking regular undergraduate classes along with younger students. Participants are able to enroll as auditors in a variety of courses, on a space-available basis. Students through this program may participate in class discussions, without writing papers or taking exams. No college credit is earned, and courses taken do not count toward completion of degree or certificate programs.



More details about the program:

- The registration fee is \$400.00 with a limit of one course per student; payable by check or cash, only.
- Auditors through this program take their courses free of tuition charge, but pay the registration fee, plus pay for books, photocopying or other fees. Students also pay for on-campus parking.
- This program registers by appointment, only. Visit the Center's website for complete registration details, including information about available classes.


