All English majors should complete 44 credits in English and maintain a GPA of 2.0 in English. Students should take 16 credits in literature, chosen from the following: 211, 212, 214, 215, 217, 218, 220, 221, 222, 297, 324, 325, 327, 334, 337, 341, 360, 361, 362, 364, 365, 366, 367, 370, 371, 372, 373, 390, and 395.

ENGL 201, 202, 203, or 204 may be taken as ENGL elective credit if all other major requirements are met.

**A minimum of 16 credits in English at or above ENGL 211 must be taken at St. Thomas**
