This document is designed for North Hennepin Community College students completing the History Transfer Pathway A.A. with the intent to transfer to the University of St. Thomas and complete the History B.A. degree. Students who do not intend to complete the 60-credit degree should contact our <u>transfer admission team</u> to plan course selections for the major and the goal areas.

Advising Notes:

REQUIREMENTS FOR MAJOR:

44 credits in major

- no more than 8 credits of which may be at the 100-level
- at least 4 credits must be numbered HIST 300-level or above
- At least twenty-four (24) of the total credits needed for the history major must be taken at the University of St. Thomas or in a St. Thomas-approved study abroad program.
- 200- and 300-level transfer courses require the approval of the department chair to be counted toward the major.
- The capstone seminar must be taken at St. Thomas.
